The Liljevalchs sofa with its matching armchair was among the first pieces that Josef Frank designed for Svenskt Tenn in 1934. They were named after an exhibition at Liljevalchs Konsthall in September the same year, where they gained attention for their voluminous shape and generous seating depth. Both the sofa and armchair were launched during a time when strict, functionalist furniture dominated the market and have come to represent Josef Frank's aversion to what he called "the Swedish Crafts Association dullness."
